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

Look below how to write the letter Aleph by hand:






You can find whichever vowel with the letter Aleph. In this case you should pronounce just the vowel, with no consonant. It is written "AH" below, in two different ways:



And if I put the letter ה beside it? It's still "AH"




And below it is written "EE":


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The following letter is the letter "Tav". It sounds T.






Copy it several times in order to practice:




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The letter Vav may sound "V", "O", or "U" (OO). Keep calm, let's do it by steps. For now, forget it can sound "V". At the moment it's just another vowel for us, by the way, two vowels: "O" or "U".

How can we know?

When the text is written with Nekudot, it's easy. If you see a dot above the letter, it's "O" (Like in Board, or Yellow). But if the dot is in the middle of the letter, it's U (OO) (like in Blue, or smooth).






